Read *Numbers 14:11,12*. By not believing, not trusting God's promises an entire generation is denied entrance into God's best for them. Their denial also sentenced their children to a lifetime of wandering. Is there a promise of God that you are rebelling against right now? How is it affecting your life? The lives of others around you?

What promise of God do you need to reclaim for yourself today? Who can you ask to pray for you as you do?
